1. INTRODUCTION

On 9 March 2001, the Promotion of Access to Information Act, No. 2 of 2000 ("the Act") became operative, giving effect to the section 32(2) Constitutional right of access to information.

One of the main requirements specified in the Act, is the compilation of an information manual that provides information on both the types and categories of records held by a private body.

This document serves as the INSPIRED TESTING information manual and provides reference to the records held by INSPIRED TESTING and the process to request access to such records.

Every private body specified in the Act, including a private company as defined in the Companies Act 61 of 1973, must lodge a copy of this manual with the South African Human Rights Commission ("SAHRC")

6. ACCESSING A RECORD HELD BY INSPIRED TESTING

- ◆ The request must be made to the COO of Inspired Testing (with responsibilities as delegated by the Head of Inspired Testing) with the contact details listed under the section entitled “**CONTACT DETAILS FOR INFORMATION REQUESTS**”
- ◆ Any request for access to records in terms of the Act must be completed on the prescribed form in terms of the Act and regulations as shown in Appendix 1.
- ◆ The requester must provide sufficient detail on the request form to enable the COO of INSPIRED TESTING to identify the record and the requester. The requester should also indicate what form of access is required.
- ◆ The requester must identify the right that he or she is seeking to exercise or protect and provide an explanation of why the requested record is required for the exercise or protection of that right.
- ◆ If a request is made on behalf of a person, the requester must then submit proof of the capacity in which the request is being made.
- ◆ The COO of INSPIRED TESTING must notify the requester by notice, requiring the requester to pay the prescribed fee (if any) before processing the request. The prescribed fee is in the Regulations of the Act.
- ◆ The head of INSPIRED TESTING will then make a decision in accordance with the provisions of the Act, whether to grant the request or not and notify the requester of the decision.
- ◆ If the request is granted, a further fee must be paid for the search, reproduction and preparation, and for any time that has exceeded the prescribed hours to search and prepare the record for disclosure.
- ◆ Legal remedies are available to a requester who believes that there has been a failure to comply with the Act. The requester may lodge an appeal or an application to court.
- ◆ Section 54 of the Act provides for a private body to require a request fee to be paid by a requester before processing a request. Information relating to the fees payable is set out in Annexure 2.

7. GROUNDS FOR REFUSAL OF ACCESS TO RECORDS

The main grounds for refusal of a request for information are:

- ◆ Mandatory protection of the privacy of a third party who is a natural person, which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of personal information of that natural person.
- ◆ Mandatory protection of the commercial information of a third party, if the record contains:
 - ◇ Trade secrets of that party.
 - ◇ Financial, commercial, scientific or technical information which disclosure could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interests of that party.
 - ◇ Information disclosed in confidence by a third party to INSPIRED TESTING if the disclosure could put that third party to a disadvantage in negotiations or commercial competition.
- ◆ Mandatory protection of confidential information of third parties if it is protected in terms of any agreement.
- ◆ Mandatory protection of the safety of individuals and the protection of property.
- ◆ Mandatory protection of records which could be regarded as privileged in legal proceedings.
- ◆ The Commercial Activities of INSPIRED TESTING which may include:
 - ◇ Trade secrets of INSPIRED TESTING
 - ◇ Financial, commercial,
 - ◇ scientific or technical information which disclosure could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interests of INSPIRED TESTING.
